Councillor Gerbasi's Message

I'm pleased to present the Winnipeg Committee for Safety's 2002 Annual Report. Within this report, you'll learn about the history of the committee, what we've done in our third year of operation and what we would like to accomplish.

My past three years with the Committee have been extremely rewarding. Step by step, effective tools have been introduced and changes have been made to improve safety. The citizens of Winnipeg have positively responded to the Committee's work. Citizen participation in neighbourhoods has increased; communities are talking and citizens are taking proactive measures to improve safety.

Since its inception, the Winnipeg Committee for Safety (WCFS) has been **community based** and **community driven**. In 2001, the Committee successfully secured generous funding through the Winnipeg Development Agreement.

This funding helped further the Committee's work by providing money to do things like produce a variety of resources (such as the **Safety Tool Box**, manuals and pamphlets) and activities like (**conflict resolution workshops** and urban planner **Greg Saville's** presentation on crime prevention through environmental design) to support, mobilize and build community capacity.

The Committee's work helps people to do safety audits, resolve neighbourhood conflicts, identify community priorities and create action plans for safety. As the past three years have demonstrated, neighbourhood safety improves when citizens are actively involved in making changes.

Safety is a complex issue that requires discussion, problem solving action. The working groups of the WCFS work on three primary areas: Downtown Safety, Youth and the Safety Tool Box. For the WCFS and its working groups, the year 2002 has been a year of identifying priorities, setting short and long-term goals to address safety concerns, networking to support community groups and providing tools to build community capacity.

This year, a formal evaluation of the Committee's tools, functioning and outreach was launched. In addition, a survey was set to 700 contacts we've made. The WCFS plans to take this feedback and use it to refine our work and approach.

I'd like to welcome **Councillor Mike Pagtakhan**, incoming Chair of the WCFS. I appreciate his enthusiasm and willingness to address safety in the city.

The contribution and commitment of each member of the WCFS has made a difference. By volunteering your time, effort and expertise, each of you has made Winnipeg a more peaceful, healthy and safe place to live.
