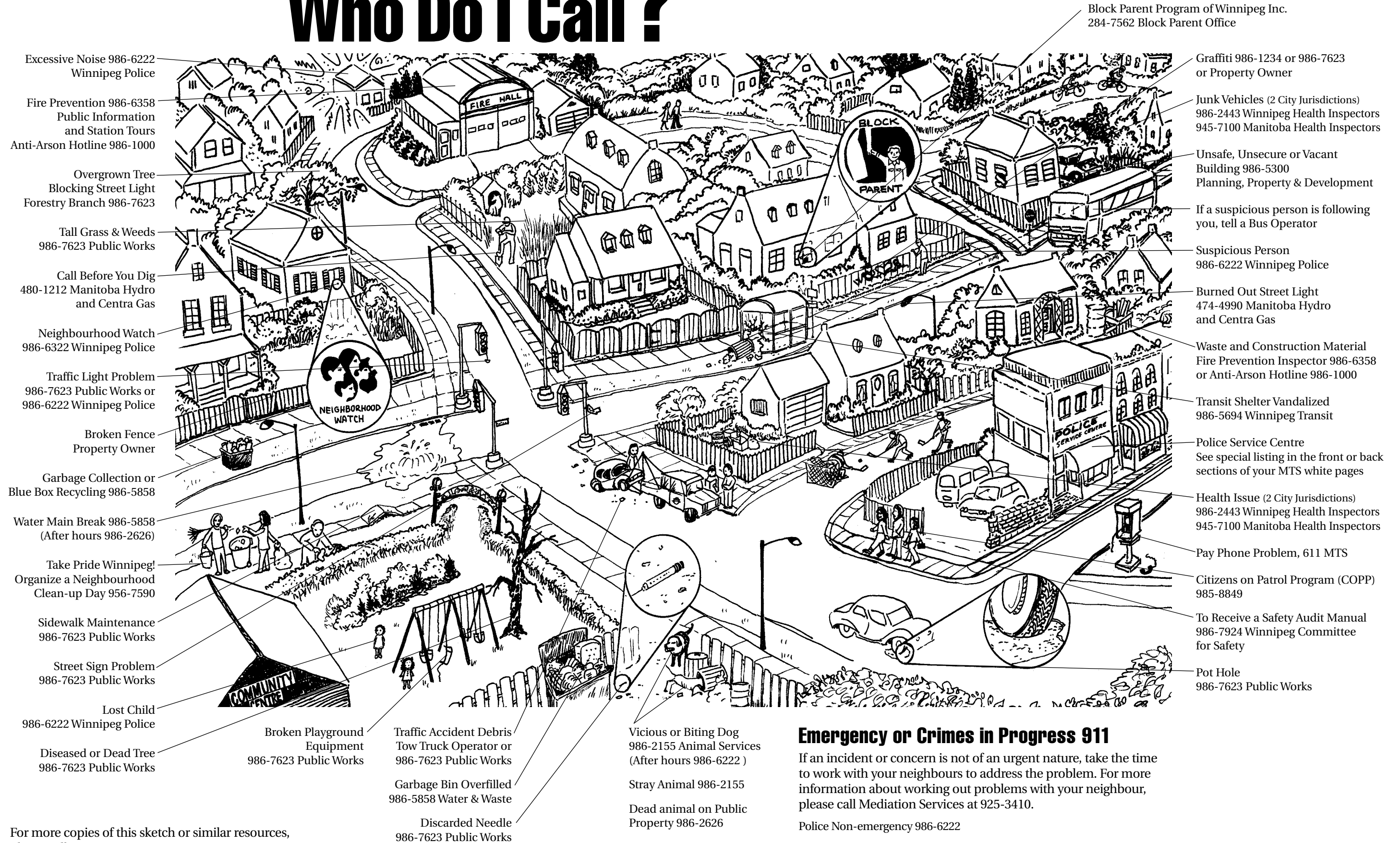

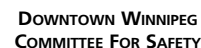

There are many community agencies and government departments that can help you to improve your neighbourhood. When you experience a problem in your community, take a look at the Who Do I Call? sketch to find the best telephone number to call.

Some neighbourhood safety issues will require longer-term solutions. Take the time to work with your neighbours to address the problem. Organize a group of people to talk about the issues and develop local activities to address them. A safe and healthy community is one in which its citizens work together to address local problems and support one another.

The Who Do I Call? sketch is a project of the Winnipeg Committee For Safety. It is only one of many resources contained in the Safety Tool Box.

The Safety Tool Box is a resource binder of activities and information for citizens and organizations to use. The tools outline step-by-step activities that you can follow to address local safety issues or implement projects.

Other community safety resources:

The Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act works by holding property owners accountable for threatening or disturbing activities that regularly take place on their property related to:

- unlawful drug use or dealing
- prostitution and related activities
- unlawful sale of liquor or intoxicating substances
- giving or selling to minors

This act refers to activities that are ongoing, not those happening occasionally.
